2. Review and Approve Agenda

a. Agenda approved.

3. Review and Approve Meeting Minutes

a. The 4/4/2018 Meeting Minutes were approved.

4. Discussion Topics

- a. Chapter 4:
 - i. The changes are mostly cleaned up, but it looks like the most current amendments can be deleted.
 - ii. Mark Murray noted the safe school plan requires all schools to have a lock-down plan. Review of RCW 28A.0320.125 and defer discussion for 2-4 weeks.

b. Chapter 9:

- i. Section 901.8.2. Discussion on deleting the state amendment since base code emulated the amended language.
- ii. Section 901.6.2. Addition of NFPA 4—deletion of retest requirements would need to be done by code proposal.
- iii. Section 904.12. Two minor changes to be reflected in the state amendments—add in references to new NFPA standards.
- iv. Section 907.2.3. It was noted there were still some numbering issues. Group will review
- v. Section 907.2.6.1. Discussion on keeping the state amendment. Group will do more research.
- vi. Section 903.3.1.2.3. There was discussion around this not really being a new requirement; it was previous required by the NFPA standard.

c. Chapter 10:

- i. Section 1010.1.4.4. Chris will submit code change to IBC for clarification and will circulate proposal for comment at the next meeting.
- d. Chapter 11:
 - i. Section 1103. CO Alarms. Chris will verify if NFPA 720 goes away.
 - ii. Section 1104. No change recommended
- e. Chapter 12:
 - i. Traci will be going to previous stakeholder groups. Deferred for more review.
- f. Chapter 22:
 - i. No state amendments.

5. Code Proposals

- a. Chris is good with the crosswalk table between the NICET requirements and ESA, would like to possibly add "or other approved alternate" in addition to NICET and ESA
 - i. The TAG discussed putting the proposal forward as an emergency rule or off-cycle rule. Will be discussed in further detail at the next meeting.

6. Other Business

- a. Traci noted the Pallet storage table, 315.7, has an error that ICC will not correct via errata that will require an amendment.
- b. How will SB 6109 affect the WUIC adoption? Traci noted it will still go through the fire code TAG but will be adopted under a separate WAC number. There was some discussion on the effective date of the legislation vs. effective date of the code. It will be further discussed at the May 16 meeting.
