### STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL

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To All Interested Parties

The State Building Code Council (Council) is seeking members for all of the Technical Advisory Groups (TAGs) in preparation for the 2018 code adoption cycle. Technical Advisory Groups review new editions of the model codes to identify significant changes, and review existing and proposed state amendments.

The Council is recruiting for positions on TAGs for the 2018 code adoption cycle. In the 2018 cycle, the state building codes are divided into two groups. Group 1 is the International Building Code (including the International Existing Building Code); the International Fire Code; and the Washington State Energy Code (Commercial). The 2018 TAGs will convene in the fall of 2017 to begin review of the Group 1 codes. The 2018 review process will conclude with a report to the standing committees. The TAGs set a meeting schedule once convened. Alternative means of participation not requiring travel is available using the internet and/or conference phone.

The Council welcomes all applicants for positions on any of the TAGs. Please submit a letter or e-mail indicating the TAG you are interested in and the constituent group you represent, along with a resume. Applicants will be asked to confirm the support of a local or statewide organization, where possible. All positions are open and previous TAG members must reapply. The deadline for applicants is August 15, 2017. The Council is seeking subject area experts from the groups listed on the tables below.

The state building code adoption process depends on involvement of the experts and professionals in the building industry. #### WAC 51-04-020

#### Policies for the consideration of proposed statewide amendments.

1) The council will accept and consider petitions for emergency statewide amendments to the building code at any time, in accordance with RCW <u>19.27.074</u> and chapter <u>34.05</u> RCW. The council will accept and consider all petitions for statewide amendments in conjunction with the state building code update cycle, in accordance with RCW <u>19.27.074</u> and chapter <u>34.05</u> RCW, and WAC <u>51-04-015</u> and 51-04-020 as follows:

(a) For the purpose of review and adoption of new model code editions and statewide amendment submission, the state building code shall be divided into two groups:

- (i) Group 1: International Building Code (IBC); International Existing Building Code (IEBC); International Fire Code (IFC) Washington state energy code-commercial (WSEC-C).
- (ii) Group 2: International Residential Code (IRC); International Mechanical Code (IMC); International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC); standards liquefied petroleum gas are National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards 58 and 54; Uniform Plumbing Code (UPC); Washington state energy coderesidential (WSEC-R).

(b) The adoption period of new model codes commences when new editions of the model codes are available to the public. Within sixty days, the council shall publish a timeline to include a report of significant model code amendments and applicability of existing state amendments, followed by a submission period for new proposed statewide amendments.

(i) The council shall review Group 1 codes and approve a report on significant changes and applicability of existing state amendments. The Group 1 report shall be posted on the council web site and a submission period of at least two months shall be allowed for new proposed statewide amendments.
