1. Welcome and Introductions	Meeting called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chair, Diane Glenn. Everyone was welcomed and introductions were made. The Chair noted that Steve Simpson's term has expired and the Governor appointed Corey Wilker as his replacement.
2. Review & Approve Agenda	The agenda was approved.
3. Public Comment on Items not on the Agenda	There was no public comment on items not on the agenda.
4. Review & Approve Minutes of April 10, 2020	The summary minutes from 4/10/2020 were approved as written.
5. Consider Extending the	There was much discussion regarding this topic, as well as several

<p>Code Effective Date Beyond November 1, 2020</p>	<p>written statements for and against delaying the Building Code effective date. (See below for written statements.)</p> <p>Regarding the National Electric Code, Labor and Industries, through emergency rule, set an effective date of October 29, 2020.</p> <p>The Governor moved the Code Effective Date, through Executive Order, to November 1, 2020. The Council has authority to extend the Code Effective Date further out through emergency rule.</p> <p>Public Comments:</p> <p>Carolyn Logue, Washington Air Conditioning Contractors Association, supports delaying the building code implementation for one year due to supply chain issues.</p> <p>Robert Glass, Goodman Manufacturing, is against delaying the building code implementation past November 1, 2020.</p> <p>Amy Wheelless, Northwest Energy Coalition and Co-Chair for Shift Zero, is against delaying the building code implementation.</p> <p>Ashley Delaney, BIAW, supports a further extension of the code past November 1, 2020.</p> <p>Sloan Ritchie, General Contractor in Western Washington, has an HVAC division and does not support moving the code extension date past November 1, 2020.</p> <p>Bill Will, Solar Installers of Washington, is against delaying the building code implementation past November 1, 2020.</p> <p>Council discussed tabling the delay vote, delaying the effective date a few more months, and not delaying at all.</p> <p>There was a motion to table the decision to the September meeting. There was not a second, so the motion was not voted on.</p> <p>There was a motion and second to extend the code implementation date to February 1, 2021.</p> <p>There were irregularities with the vote and Under Robert's Rules, the vote was null and void.</p> <p>Unless the Council takes up this issue again, November 1, 2020 will stand as the code effective date.</p>
<p>6. Addressing UPC Fixture requirements from 2019 2SHB1444 concerning appliance efficiency standards with an effective date of 1/1/2021</p>	<p>Richard gave an overview of the CR102 route for this agenda item. This document is attached.</p>
<p>7. MVE Committee Report</p>	<p>Kjell Anderson, MVE Committee Chair, gave an overview of the last MVE Committee meeting on 6/5/2020. The summary minutes are attached. There was no public comment.</p>
<p>8. 2021 TAG Composition</p>	<p>Both the TAG composition and timeline were approved as amended.</p>
