Agenda Items	Committee Actions/Discussion
1. Welcome and Introductions	Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Andrew Klein, Committee Chair. Everyone was welcomed and roll was called. A quorum of the Committee was present.
2. Review and Approve Agenda	The agenda was approved as written.
3. Review and Approve Minutes	The minutes from the February 17, 2022, meeting were not completed and will be reviewed and approved at the next scheduled meeting.
4. Review Modifications Proposed to 2021 IBC and IFC Public Testimony	<p>Stoyan Bumbalov explained the verbatim transcript and records of the public hearings are posted on the SBCC website.</p> <p>Stoyan Bumbalov reviewed the 2021 International Building Code-Nonstructural Provisions Testimony Summary. Discussion was held on sections where the position was to modify sections submitted with the CR-102.</p> <p>Section 429.1 Electrical vehicle charging for new</p>

construction. Stoyan Bumbalov noted there were several submissions for this section. He reviewed the proposals, both original and current, and explained staff's recommendation to Council. Discussion was held on the subject.

MOTION: Micah Chappell moved to maintain the Current Proposal in Section 429. Corey Wilker seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Section 909.11.1. Stoyan Bumbalov showed the written comment that was submitted, and it was noted that specific language was not proposed. It was noted this would need to be a code change proposal for the next code cycle as it would be a significant change.

MOTION: Micah Chappell moved for no modifications to the current proposal. Corey Wilker seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Section 903.3.1.2 received a couple of submissions and Ray Shipman noted these were also part of the Fire Code and can be discussed further during the review of Fire Code testimony. Discussion was held on the proposal and 21-GP1-021 was reviewed.

MOTION: Micah Chappell moved to maintain the TAG recommendation of moving the proposal forward, as written. Corey Wilker seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Section 429. Stoyan Bumbalov reviewed the proposal. Discussion was held.

MOTION: Micah Chappell moved to maintain the current proposal for the EV infrastructure. Corey Wilker seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Section 1110.2 proposal and testimony was reviewed by Micah Chappell and recommended changes were noted. Discussion was held. Stoyan Bumbalov stated he will conduct further research and work with Micah Chappell in preparation for the Council meeting, tomorrow.

MOTION: Micah Chappell moved to forward this to Council for further discussion. Corey Wilker seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Section 1109.2 and sections of Chapter 29 proposal and testimony were reviewed by Micah Chappell. Discussion was held.

MOTION: Corey Wilker moved to forward to Council. Micah Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed.
